Social Workers are Essential

This year's Social Work Month theme, "Social Workers Are Essential," embodies the heroic contributions of the Social Work profession to our nation, including the work Social Workers have done to heal our nation during these times of pandemic, racial unrest, economic uncertainty and political divisiveness.

The concept of social work arose in the United States in the years following the Civil War, as the country dealt with needs of veterans, widows and orphans, a rising population of immigrants and freedman, the former slaves who were now emancipated. Voluntary service organizations, faith-based institutions and benevolent societies were formed to address the needs of persons who struggled to care for themselves or their families. Some of the best known nonprofit organization in the country, think of the YMCA or the American Red Cross, as well as local institutions and settlement houses, like Hull House in Chicago, or fraternal organizations like the Hibernians were formed or expanded in this era. They founded hospitals, fire departments, public health program, orphanages and "old age homes," life and health insurance and pension plans.

Benjamin Rose Joins the MetroHealth Buckeye Community Resource Center

Benjamin Rose Institute on Aging will be joining the Buckeye Community Resource Center at the MetroHealth Community Health Center. Designated staff from Behavioral Health Services, ESOP, WeCare and Rose Centers will be rotating remote and onsite office hours at Benjamin Rose's satellite office. MetroHealth

offers more than health care services at their Buckeye Health Center. They work with community organizations to offer: family support services, housing and utility assistance, food assistance, safety information, educational services and financial education. The services are provided by community based organizations (CBO) and available to everybody in the community not just MetroHealth patients.

Our Answer to the Digital Divide



We just passed a significant calendar milestone: one year of sheltering in place. While this has been a psychologically and emotionally taxing time for all of us, take a moment to think about how you would have fared this past year without the benefit of virtual connectivity to family, friends, medical services, banking and having basic needs delivered, like food and household essentials. No Zoom, No Facebook. No Amazon. No ability to connect with loved ones and essential services other than a telephone.

Social isolation was already one of the biggest challenges facing our older adult population. COVID-19 and the Digital Divide -- the gap between those able to benefit from the

digital age and those who are not -- exacerbated this problem significantly, leaving many members of our community virtually shut out from the rest of society.

Worse, many of our seniors live on fixed incomes, struggle to make ends meet financially, and cannot afford the technology required to keep them engaged socially and connected to critical social services that ensure their basic needs are met.

<u>Empowering and Strengthening Ohio's People (ESOP)</u>, a subsidiary of Benjamin Rose Institute on Aging, in partnership with <u>Ashbury Senior Community Computer Center (ASC3)</u>, and <u>DigitalC</u>, is proud to announce a new collaborative program: Virtual Services for Older Adults.
